Programme Description

The School of Law and Social Sciences offers a single legal studies programme leading to a single degree and offering appropriate knowledge on Greek and Cypriot Law. Particular emphasis is placed on the commercial law and European Union law, whereas academic knowledge is combined with the appropriate practical experience. The Programme completely covers the necessary knowledge a student must have, in order to become accepted from the Bar association of Greece and take part in the exams of the Cyprus Bar association.

At the end of the Programme the student will be able to:

- Recognize the basic concepts and principles governing the legal systems of Greece and Cyprus, as well as the influence of the international legal system and the European Union Law on them
- Understand the political and social parameters which affect the law-making process and its application
- Conduct a legal research in a methodical and effective manner, in order to construct arguments
- Be able to conduct critical analysis and legal reasoning and use these skills in order to deal with particular legal issues
- Structure comprehensive and consistent law arguments and express himself/herself verbally and in writing with clarity and precision
- Evaluate the various legal arguments and select the most appropriate ones, according to the case at hand
- Pinpoint the most important legal issues arising from complicated cases and deal with them successfully
- Use his/her academic knowledge in order to deal with actual law cases

Career Prospects

The graduates of the Neapolis Law School may be registered with the Bar association of Cyprus and the Bar associations of other European countries, including Greece, as they will fulfil the necessary requirements for Legal practice.



Practical Dimension

An integral part of each course of the Bachelor of Law is to familiarize the student with the practical dimension of legal issues. In each course there is an analysis of judgments, to investigate the practical application of legal theory ("Book of Trials", "Legal Clinic", etc.). Additionally mock trials are organized, in order for the student to gain experience in the practice of law. Finally, the Practical Training familiarizes the student with the practical dimension of justice and how it is exercised in practice during trial.



Research Aspect of the Bachelor of Law

For successful completion of the Bachelor of Law (LLB), it's required from the student to write scientific papers – Work in which the score is counted in the final grade of each course. This condition is designed to enable the student to learn to investigate systematically, to work independently and effectively using bibliographic and other legal sources

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Master in European Governance (MEG)

Programme Description

The Postgraduate Programme in European Governance is a one academic year and aims to offer specialized labor market experts the issues and the functioning of the European Union. Aimed primarily at graduates who are already working and are interested in career related activities supported by national agencies or departments of the EU in both the private and public sector. The European Union currently holds an ever-increasing influence on the functioning of Member States and European businesses, organizations and other entities, as well as the activation of self-employed in Europe and in the field of world class environment.

The Master of European Governance combines approaches from the perspective of law, economics, management and policy, to offer the student a multifaceted consideration of issues that are necessary for a deeper understanding of the policies and functioning of the European Union.

The first half of the Master of European Governance provides the basic knowledge of European integration, while the second offers specialization in international economic, political and other components of the EU also includes specific practical training of students in the techniques of negotiation and lobbying.

The Master of European Governance concludes with the writing of an original dissertation that will broaden their knowledge and skills developed in lessons and will approach issues with a view to solving practical problems in relation to the EU and its member states.

Participants in the Master of European Governance are taught by university professors who possess knowledge and experience in individual items, but also by invited speakers from the workplace, international organizations, the EU etc. The University also offers an attractive learning environment and a multidisciplinary approach is essential for the understanding of European issues.

Professional Certification – Prospects

Both in Cyprus and in Greece and other European Union countries, the demand for specialists on European affairs is growing every day. This development is due to the growing role of the EU (and related decisions in Brussels and in institutions in general) in the daily operation of the Member States and the economic, administrative and political life.

Unlike many other similar programmes, this Master of European Governance focuses more on the knowledge and practical skills that the modern civil servant, lawyer, businessman, economist etc. need to obtain in order to successfully compete in the growing international and European environment. Graduates will also be able to effectively seek executive positions in international organizations, large corporations, consultancies, legal and accounting firms, non-governmental organizations, etc.

Master in International and European Business Law (LLM)

Programme Description

This Master aims to provide a high-quality Programme for those aspiring to become successful law practitioners, consultants and academics specialized in International and EU Business Law. The curriculum is designed to explore the basics of International and EU Business Law and to prepare students for the increasingly complex legal transactions and negotiations, in areas such as banking, transport and energy. The core courses focus on the skills and knowledge needed to understand multi-jurisdictional legislation in the wider system of International and European Business Law.

The Programme provides up-to-date knowledge in many areas of law which constitute the field of International and European Business Law, such as commercial law, the law and regulation of competition, energy law, banking and insurance law, tax law and corporate governance. Lawyers and Law School graduates will additionally be provided with essential knowledge in Political Science and Economics and will be equipped with analytical, accountability and leadership skills in order to enhance their decision-making capacity and to promote good practice within the context of a changing and competitive International and Business Law environment.

The fundamental philosophy surrounding the Programme is to offer an empirical approach to the study of Business and Law, where the newly acquired knowledge and skills are combined with students' experience to be promptly applied in the actual working environment.

This approach both broadens and deepens the students' understanding in multi-jurisdictional legislation and cross-border legal issues. Additionally, it reinforces their skills of investigation, analysis, synthesis and creativity and helps them comprehend the role and importance of legal advice in international legal acts.

Career Prospects

The Programme explores the fundamentals of International and European Business Law and prepares students to successfully handle complex legal transactions and have an active role in legal negotiations, most notably in the banking, transport and energy sectors.
