

Kathryn Moore, President of the International Federation of Landscape Architects (IFLA) and Professor of Landscape Architecture at Birmingham City University has published extensively on design quality, theory, education and practice. Her book Overlooking the Visual: Demystifying the Art of Design (2010) provides the basis for critical, artistic discourse. Her teaching, research and practice, set within landscape architecture have clear implications for architecture, planning, urban design and other art and design disciplines, in addition to philosophy, aesthetics and education more generally. Chair of the pilot design review panel for the High Speed 2 (HS2) landscape guidelines, she has taken a lead role in redefining the relationship between landscape, culture and governance, finance, health and community engagement within the context of the Birmingham region and has recently been appointed as an independent national panel member of the HS2 Ltd Design Panel. The HS2 Landscape Vision (HS2LV) and Tame Valley Landscape Vision initiative she is developing, is described as being "...in the spirit of all the great landscape evolutions in the country, seizing an opportunity to reinvent and rekindle the connection between the people and the countryside in a way not seen for decades" by Andrew Grant, Grant Associates, (winner of The RIBA Lubetkin Prize in 2013) and is of international interest.

A strategic thinker, responsible at Salford City Council for the award-winning Landscape Group, her design work includes the re-visioning of Salford Quays and significant and widespread derelict land reclamation, urban regeneration, public realm creation and landscape management. After moving to BCU in 1988 she worked with Gillespies and Camlin Lonsdale. before setting up her own consultancy, Design Muse in 2007, working with Martha Schwartz Inc, for the Living Landmarks Big Lottery Fund bid for Birmingham City Council and with Lovejoys, Birmingham for the design of major new public realm adjacent to Nottingham Castle, a park in Leicester. This built on an earlier project creating an urban vision for the Black Country, West Midlands in 2005 which evolved into a study of regeneration catalysts. Advising UNESCO on the feasibility of an international landscape convention, she has worked with the Council of Europe to evaluate the implementation of the European Landscape Convention and is a juror for a number of international competitions including Golden Square, the Jewellery Quarter, Birmingham, the Olympic Velodrome, London, the Seoul Yeouido Riverside Park, Korea and the New Birmingham City Park, UK. As president of IFLA she leading the transformation of the organisation and is a founding partner of the World Design Summit, planned for Montreal in October.

Involving the synthesis of various threads; the analysis of a painting, the site and its context, the brief and significant cultural issues such as climate change, water, energy and transport to create a new cultural promenade and centre for American contemporary culture for Washington DC. Challenging many traditional preconceptions and assumptions underlying the creation of large-scale spatial design it investigated a way for conceptual, artistic practice to become a fundamental part of strategic decision-making. Developing a new way to understand and make propositions for Washington, the work of this studio informs large scale masterplanning projects subsequently undertaken at BCU (see below).

The aim of the studio is to demonstrate that there is no choice but to engage with ideas at every stage of the design process and in order to develop artistic practice we need to express these ideas and feelings in space, words, shadow, light and form to manipulate and shape the quality of experience. The understanding that even the most intimate, seemingly magical elements of the design process are based on knowledge and knowledge alone, prepares the ground for a fresh artistic and conceptual approach to design, as well as establishing it as a holistic, critical endeavour. Providing a structured framework to guide students through what are often taken to be the impossibly subjective aspects of design, the purpose is to demystify the design process by considering design as an analytical, artistic, observant and interpretative activity. It considers aspects of the process usually regarded as un-teachable or inaccessible but somehow essential to design, such as inspiration, concepts and spatial principles, generating form and design rhetoric. Projects this year are Baskeverille and the walk between the Mail Box and Millennium Point.

The International Studio, supported by an international lecture series has been run since 2005 (for 2013/4 programme of lectures and videos of 2012/3 lectures see http://landscapebiad.wix.com/home, http:// kathrynmoorelandscape.tumblr.com/). Building on the ethos of the design process studio, the project explores the design and construction of topics such as an outdoor foyer, a shelter or a lookout, from a conceptual and artistic standpoint. Aiming to ensure that ideas, expertise and knowledge are used to inform all design decisions down to the selection of materials and method of construction, it challenges the notion that certain aspects of the design process, such detailed design is neutrally objective or self evident. To establish the conceptual basis of the project students are required to research and synthesise several threads such as desktop study of the site, the investigation of a given topic.

Also supported by the international lecture series, to help build theory to inform practice, the generating influences for this planting design project come from study of an iconic landscape. Students identify and explain the artistic, conceptual rationale of spatial decisions, identify spatial principles and use these as the basis of a contemporary design in a different time and place. In addition to working drawings, the basis of compositional decisions, selection of materials and detailed expression of ideas are justified and explained in the form of a design storyboard.

Module LAN 6401 design process, history and theory

Birming ham City University: Graduate conversion year, Graduate Diploma Landscape Architecture (conversion year), Kathryn Moore

Exploring the boundary between design practice and theory, connecting ideas to form, the lecture series examines the spatial implications of philosophical beliefs by focusing on why things look like they do, given the time, place and culture, the relationship presumed to exist between people and their environment and the impact these ideas have on the design process, focusing mainly on the 20th/21st Centuries. Assessed through exhibition and report.

Final year major design thesis

Full time diploma and part time postgraduate year 2, Post Graduate Diploma Landscape Architecture Kathryn Moore + Mark Cowell

Taught for over 20 years, the final design thesis is the culmination of the postgraduate diploma course. Following the traditional model from developing a brief, survey and analysis, master planning at 1:2500 or 1:1250 through to detailed design, the standard achieved by the international cohort is consistently assessed as excellent by the external examiners, the accrediting body responsible for monitoring the course and practitioners. In 2009/10 two high profile landscape infrastructure projects were offered, one in Washington DC (to coincide with a similar studio from UVA and Harvard GSD) the other in East Birmingham. Design research projects, these encouraged students to contribute to the growing international debate responding to the urgent need to develop new approaches to spatial planning, the renewal of transport systems and climate adaptation, and a strong desire to connect aesthetics, tectonics and culture to the social and physical context of our lives. Continuing with projects in Kidderminster and East Birmingham, the studio is investigating the impact of the proposed high speed trainlink between London and Birmingham in collaboration with the City Council.
